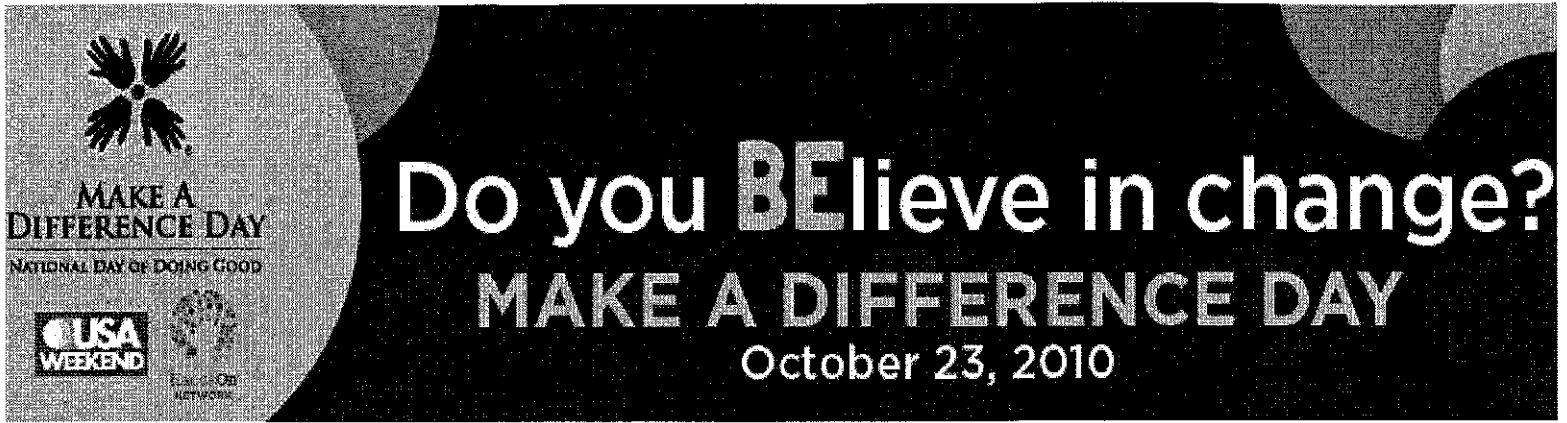

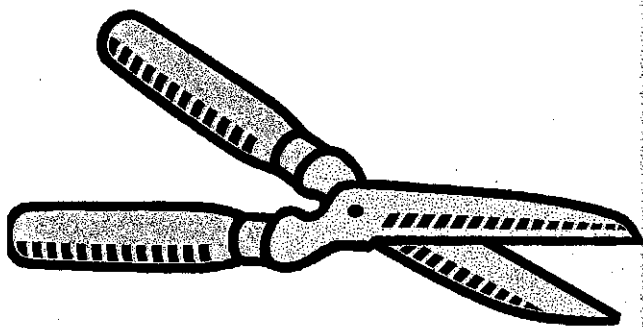

Spring and Summer
